



TESTIMONIES OF GRACE



Bryce Poore was baptized on April 20, 2025.

"My wife Tammy and I live in Lincoln and have been married for 28 years. We have a son, Michael, and a daughter, Rachel. We have 5 grandchildren: Gavin, Daisy, Allison, Elias, and Logan.

"When I was a child, a friend named Bev Bennet started bringing me to church at Indian Hills. When I was nine, she helped me accept Jesus into my heart here at church in a hallway. I was a happy young 'believer', but I strayed from God when I was a teenager. I always claimed to be a Christian, but the way I lived spoke differently.

"At age 29 I suffered a spinal injury that left me in chronic pain. Instead of remembering my professed faith, I let anger and bitterness take over. I lived that way for many years. A few years ago I decided to start going to church again. I was invited to a Bible study group, and I went. I wanted to be close to God, but I didn't have His peace in my heart.

"I went to Gil's Wednesday night class on Romans. God used that class to open my eyes and convict me. We are to identify with Christ's death and resurrection. We are to die to our sin and live a new life. I knew that I had never done that. I had been trying to keep one foot in heaven and one in the world. After speaking with Gil, I took his advice and settled it once for all.

"I chose Jesus and asked Him to come into my life in January 2024 and now have dedicated my life to Him as my Lord and Savior. I will never be perfect in this life as I am a work in progress. I finally have the peace in my heart I longed for, and I know that God's not done with me yet as He has a purpose for Me. I want my baptism to show my obedience and love to Christ and show others that I identify with Him." •



Tammy Poore was baptized on April 20, 2025.

"I have been attending Indian Hills for over three years.

I was raised to believe in God and went to church and also attended a children's Bible study class. I asked Jesus to come into my heart to be my Savior when I was 7 years old. But in my teenage years I followed the world and was misguided. I met my husband Bryce and we started to go to church and asked Jesus to save me and now I follow the narrow road. I know that one must believe in the Lord Jesus Christ so that forgiveness of sins can be mine. I have seen the Lord's work in my life over the years and although I am not perfect, I have my struggles, I am clean before the Lord's eyes.

"I read the Bible every day and do devotions. I spread the Wtord with everyone I know and pray for my family's salvation. I have a wonderful husband, two children and five grandchildren and I am very proud of them all.

"I am being baptized today to be obedient to Christ and to show others that He is my Lord and Savior and that I publicly identify with Him." •



Chris Wieskamp was baptized on April 20, 2025.

"I was raised in Panama, NE. I graduated from Norris, where I met my wife, Jessica. After high school, I attended UNL and lived in the AO house while acquiring a degree in Software engineering. Today, I work as a software engineer for Mutual of Omaha. I began attending Indian Hills 7 years ago, right before starting college. In addition to regularly attending services, my wife and I attend a home Bible study, and I recently joined the choir.

"I grew up in a believing home where I attended an Evangelical church and participated in youth activities. My parents led by example in the home and encouraged me to pursue a relationship with Christ. For several years, I lived in knowledge without

action. My purpose was misplaced in my deeds, worldly interests, and relationships.

"In middle school, my church offered a special class where a teacher led my peers and me through the books of the Bible. It was more than just hearing stories; we read God's Word and discussed it. This class helped me better understand the Lord, the truth of His Word, and the penalty for my sins. I believe this class and its fruitful discussion eventually led to my salvation. For me, there wasn't a single defining moment, but over the next several months and years, the Holy Spirit worked in my heart.

"Through this process, I came to recognize that I do not deserve God's grace, and there is nothing I can do to earn it. Yet, He allowed me to trust in the death of Christ as payment for my sins. As a result, I noticed separation from the interests of my friends throughout high school. Temptations still surrounded me, but the Lord helped guard my heart. When I did sin, I felt the conviction from the Holy Spirit and recognized my need to repent. The Lord replaced my old attitudes and perspectives and allowed me to form

new relationships with other believers who have helped guide my walk with Him. Since becoming a believer, I have experienced both seasons of growth and times of stagnation. I praise the

Lord that He has not let my heart become hardened. Instead, He has always guided me to repent and grow closer to Him." +



Jessica Wieskamp was baptized on April 20, 2025.

"I was raised in a small town outside of Lincoln. My parents are Clark and Janell Papke, and I am the youngest of three girls. I now live here in Lincoln with my husband. Chris, and work as a nurse in the Neuro/Trauma ICU at Bryan West.

"I was raised by believing parents here at Indian Hills. We did all the church things growing up, but it was only a routine for me. From a young age, I convinced myself I was saved, and I thought I convinced those around me as well.

"As I progressed through high school, I began to have a more visible 'double life.' I was one person at church and with my believing friends, and an entirely other person at school. Lying to my parents, going to parties, chasing after the world's version of enjoyment.

"My sin left me with nothing but emptiness, yet I loved my sin too much to give it up. During my senior year while at high school camp, God used the lessons that week to soften my heart and open my eyes to the state I was in. I finally truly understood I could not continue to call myself a Christian while living a life characterized by sin. That week God undeservingly poured His grace on me, and I repented of the life I had been living. As I finished high school and entered college, I no longer had a desire to live as I once did. I now strive to honor and glorify the Lord with all He has blessed me with, and faithfully serve those He has placed in my life and grow closer to Him." +

Gwyneth Terry was baptized on April 20, 2025.

"My whole life, I was the typical church kid. I was in attendance every Sunday and I would go to all the Girls of Grace events and junior high activities to hangout with my friends.


"Growing up in the church, I heard the gospel taught every week and I truly believed that I was saved. In my high school years I started to fall into the wrong crowd. I was living to fit into this world and the people that I surrounded myself with, and I was lying to everyone around me—including myself.

"It wasn't until my junior-going-into-senior year of camp that I was truly able to reflect back on my life and be honest with myself.

"One of the teachers there said, 'the biggest compromise a person can make is hearing the gospel and doing nothing about it.'

"I instantly had an enormous wave of guilt flood over me. I realized in that moment what I had been doing all my life and I could not stand to live with my sin any longer. That is when I gave my life over to my Lord and Savior.

"By His grace I was saved and in Him I am a new creation. This sometimes resulted in the loss of friends, but it also produced a better attitude, more patience with others, more time in the Word, and a change in tone and speech toward others. Everyday, I strive to live a life pleasing to Him." •
